TRIP TO INDIA

Earlier this month, the winners of the Wings of Hope Achievement Award travelled to Southern India to visit the school which we support in Pondicherry. The 9 boys from two teams (joint winners this year) jetted off for this incredible prize to see the educational development project that Wings of Hope fund. Rohit, Tej and Rikin tell us about their thoughts and experiences:

"The trip to India this year was truly remarkable for two reasons. Firstly, it allowed us as friends to relax and enjoy the beauty and heritage of such a historic country and, secondly, it allowed us to truly appreciate the material items and the life we have back in Britain."

"In our first 3 days, we worked in a nearby school where we taught ages 7 - 16. Smart boards were set up in some classrooms, a true testament to the work of WOHAA for

funding such advanced technological equipment."

"Before we paid our last visit to school, a culture variety show was performed by both the WOHAA winners and the school. It was beyond doubt that we were outshone in style, flair, costumes, speech and anything else not included in the list. Although our 7 minute sketch did receive a few chuckles for brief moments, it was no comparison to the dramatic tale by the school".

"During the teaching experience, it was incredible to learn the difference in the student-teacher relationship in India and Britain. Within India, the students would address us as sirs and would stand up to answer a question, whereas in Britain, lessons prove to be a little different."

Staying in the principal's personal apartment was an honour for some, excluding Vishaal who found a lizard in his room and started screaming and unsuccessfully chasing it for 30 minutes. We met the Minister of Foreign Affairs in Delhi which was a great opportunity. He explained how India is a very open country, and they are encouraging people with a background in India to return there in order to contribute towards its rapid economic growth. We were flattered after the worldwide magazine - Indian Empire - wanted to publish an an article about our group."
